

Treasure Valley Classical Academy (TVCA) is thrilled to announce an exciting opportunity for enthusiastic school bus drivers who are eager to make a significant, positive impact in the lives of our students. Our dedicated drivers will safely transport students to and from school along established routes, contributing to their daily educational journey. Our bus routes are scheduled for the mornings and afternoons, typically providing around 20 to 25 hours of rewarding work each week. To show our appreciation for this vital role, we offer competitive hourly wages. Additionally, this position includes eligibility for State Retirement benefits through the Public Employee Retirement System of Idaho (PERSI).

We invite applications from individuals who possess experience as a bus driver and hold a valid Commercial Driver's License (CDL) with both the P (Passenger) and S (School Bus) endorsements, as well as an air-brake endorsement. However, Treasure Valley Classical Academy is proud to provide paid training for dependable drivers who may not yet have prior experience. Applicants should have a clean driving record, a minimum of three years of personal driving experience. They must be able to pass a Department of Transportation (DOT) physical examination, a pre-employment drug screening, and a comprehensive criminal background check. Furthermore, all applicants must be at least 21 years old to be considered for this position.

The mission of TVCA is to train the minds and improve the hearts of students through a classical, content-rich curriculum that emphasizes virtuous living, traditional learning, and civic responsibility. The vision is to form future citizens who uphold the ideals of our country's founding and promote the continuation of our American experiment—through a classical, great books curriculum designed to engage the student in the highest matters and the deepest questions of truth, justice, virtue, and beauty.

Treasure Valley Classical Academy is a tuition-free charter school serving students in grades K-12. The elementary curriculum includes explicit phonics instruction in spelling and reading, traditional grammar instruction, the Core Knowledge sequence (distinct from the Common Core) in literature, history, and science, Singapore math, and the study of Latin and Greek roots. Students in seventh and eighth grades will be required to study Latin, with an additional year of Latin necessary in high school. In the upper elementary grades, students will engage in the reading of classic literature and participate in Socratic discussions. The upper school curriculum will focus on the reading and discussion of significant literary works, primary sources in history, and a comprehensive understanding of both factual knowledge and concepts in mathematics and the sciences. Art and music education will be mandatory for all students from kindergarten through 12th grade, with additional art and music electives available. To graduate, all seniors must write a senior thesis and present and defend it orally before their peers, faculty members, and the principals.
